Flagstone is such a hard rock, it makes a nearly indestructible patio. Installing flagstone on crushed stone is easy if done properly. Laying flagstone patios in sand is not difficult, although the stone itself can be heavy. Laying a flagstone patio is like building a puzzle. The stone used for this flagstone patio project is "thick. Since the shape of this stone is irregular, laying a flagstone patio is like putting a puzzle together. The thickest, widest pieces will give you the most stability.

Laying flagstone patios in sand, as opposed to mortar or concrete, is known as dry construction." Dry construction is easier for do-it-yourselfers than wet construction. Not having to worry about finishing your stone placement before a layer of mortar hardens makes for a much more happy-go-lucky project. You can make adjustments as you go, on your own time-table. However, wet construction is more permanent. Stone laid in sand will have to be re-adjusted over the years. As settling occurs, you will have to add sand, to keep the desired level. If you don't mind tinkering with a project after it's done, this shouldn't present a problem. Just make sure you stay on top of it, so you don't end up with a lawsuit after someone trips over a loose piece. You can be creative in your design, but try to keep the spaces between the stones relatively small and try to keep the tops relatively flush.

In this case, we are working with very irregular stones, so we expect a somewhat uneven surface. You may have to add or remove sand to level each individual stone. Continue to check your level as you go along. You can use the edge of a board to smooth large areas.
